The Big Picture

- 2L Fall: Qualifying Round
 - Two phases:
 - All teams: Appellant Brief
 - Top 16 teams: Appellee Brief (two separate briefs) and Oral Argument
- 2L Spring: Semi-Finals
 - Top Four teams submit briefs and conduct oral argument for a new problem
- 3L Fall: Final
 - Final Two teams submit briefs and conduct oral argument for a new problem



Schedule

- Thursday, **September 14**: Register for Q-Round by 12:00pm.
- Friday, **September 15:** Records will be distributed by 6:00pm via email and/or pick up in BSA Office WCC 2051.
- Thursday, **September 28:** Deadline to replace a member via email by 12:00pm.
- Friday, **October 13**: Appellant briefs due by 1:00pm. Withdrawal deadline.
- Monday, October 17: Teams are informed if they move on and will receive opposing briefs by 5:00 PM.
- Monday, **October 30**: Appellee briefs due by 1pm.

Be aware of the quick turn around for appellee briefs (two weeks).

• Wednesday, **November 8** and Thursday, **November 9**: Oral Arguments



Team Members

• Qualifying Round: 4 members, must be 2Ls

- Replacement of Teammate Date: Thursday, September 28
- Any replacement after this date will only be permitted in extraordinary circumstances
- Semi-final Round: 6 members (original 4, and 2 new members who <u>must</u> have participated in the qualifying round)
- Both Rounds: Designate one member as Captain, <u>all</u> communications with Ames administrators will be done by / with the Captain



Team Responsibilities

•Any participant or team who withdraws after the deadline may be referred to the Administrative Board.

•Any participant or team who does not appear at a scheduled oral argument may be referred to the Administrative Board.

•Every participant must make a good-faith effort in both briefs and oral argument to receive a Written Work Requirement creditc (option 2)



Team Organization

- Phase 1 of Qualifying Round: Each team will write one appellant brief
 The highest scoring 16 teams advance to Phase 2 of Qualifying Round
- Phase 2 of Qualifying Round: Each team will write two appellee briefs in response to two appellant briefs
- Phase 2 of Qualifying Round: Each team will participate in four oral arguments
 - Each team member must participate in only two arguments
- *If you do not advance to the second phase of the Qualifying Round, you will NOT participate in oral argument.*

Research and Outside Assistance

- You <u>cannot</u> consult any person not on your team
- You <u>can</u> consult briefs or oral arguments from real practice or moot court, <u>only</u> if those materials are generally available on the Internet
- Research using <u>only</u> the materials generally available in the Harvard University library system (e.g. LEXIS, Westlaw)



Briefs: Helpful Tips

- Pay special attention to the rules when writing your brief
- Note what does and what does not count toward your word limit (e.g., footnotes)
- Qualifying Round briefs can be used to help satisfy the Written Work Requirement. But <u>must</u> write <u>both</u> appellant and appellee briefs, even if you do not advance to the Qualifying Round second phase



Oral Argument

- Review these rules if you make it to Phase 2 of the Qualifying Round
- Judges will be made up of HLS faculty, practitioners, and 3L BSAs.
- Guests are not permitted



Advancing to the Semi-Final Round

- The <u>four</u> highest scoring teams across both Phases of the Qualifying Round will advance to the semi-final round
- The score is calculated by adding:
 - Appellant Brief Score + Appellee Brief Score + Team Average Oral Advocacy Score
- Semi-finals will occur during the spring semester
